OATH CEREMONY FOR NEWLY APPOINTED CITY MANAGER MR. VINCENT PASTUE

Vincent Pastue took a ceremonial oath as new City Manager of Farmington.

Council welcomed Mr. Pastue to the City and expressed their anticipation of a long and rewarding relationship.

Mr. Pastue stated that he also is looking forward to a long term relationship with the City.

<u>PRESENTATION: RRRASOC ANNUAL REPORT – MICHAEL CSAPO, GENERAL</u> MANAGER

Mike Csapo, General Manager of Resource, Recovery and Recycling Authority of Southwest Oakland County (RRRASOC), began his presentation by welcoming Mr. Pastue to the City. Mr. Csapo spoke about Farmington's excellent recycling rate and its favorable comparison to other cities. He further spoke about a recycling record that was set as a result of the household hazardous waste program that included over 4000 participants delivering a total of 136 tons of material. He talked about the success of a hazardous waste event held last year, sponsored by the Cities of Farmington/Farmington Hills, which produced a large turnout. He complimented the staff of Farmington/Farmington Hills for their cooperation and efforts in this event. He further stated that the turnout of Farmington residents for this type of event was three times the national norm.

Mr. Csapo spoke about issues that will be addressed in 2003 including proposed legislation dealing with import and export of solid waste. He spoke about additional goals for 2003 that include implementation of a free commercial waste audit; telephone recycling program; and an attitudinal survey of residents regarding recycling to be conducted by Oakland Community College students.

Responding to a question from Council, Mr. Csapo stated that there is currently proposed legislation regarding the reclassification of water bottles that would increase the recycling rate and reduce littering.

Responding to an additional question, Mr. Csapo stated that the revenue from recyclables is volatile with no way to predict future income. In response to another question, Mr. Csapo stated that there has been a small downslide of hard recyclables, however, yard waste recycling has increased.

Responding to a final question, Mr. Csapo stated that RRRASOC has not yet been involved with Farmington's Commission on the Environment but looked forward to future participation.

Mr. Csapo stated that RRRASOC would continue to protect the City's interests in Lansing.

Council thanked Mr. Csapo for his presentation.
