Background

The City of Farmington bills all water meters for both water and sewer charges. No exceptions are made for lawn irrigation meters.

If lawn irrigation meters are permitted to be billed for water usage only, Sewer rates will need to be adjusted for the lost volume of sewage billing. Listed below are the current cost of water meters and associated cost to install a second water meter.

¾ inch meter\$1881 inch meter\$2251 ½ inch meter\$6202 inch meter\$800Installation cost estimate\$500Residential Permit/Inspection fees\$70-\$80Commercial Permit/Inspection fee\$90-\$110

Estimated cost to install a second meter for lawn irrigation:

Residential \$760-\$805 Commercial \$1210-\$1410

Property owners would be required to apply for a plumbing permit and purchase a new water meter from the City. It is estimated a property owner would incur \$500 of cost to install an irrigation water meter by a licensed plumber. Following installation this irrigation system meter, the irrigation system information shall be added to the Cross Connection Inspection schedule.

Administrative staff have reviewed the seasonal flow change due to lawn irrigation. The attached schedule reflects rate increases that may be necessary for all property owners to maintain a constant revenue due to permitting of irrigation meters.

Charitable Gaming License for Global Health Charities event in Plymouth, MI

<u>Proposed Motion</u>: Move to approve the State of Michigan's Charitable Gaming License for Global Health Charities of Farmington for a fundraising event they are holding at the Inn at St. Johns in Plymouth, Michigan on Oct. 6, 2017.

Background:

Global Health Charities of Farmington is holding a fundraising event at the Inn at St. Johns in Plymouth, Michigan on Oct. 6, 2017. The organization is required by the State of Michigan to "provide a local governing body resolution for charitable gaming license" from the municipality in which the non-profit originates.

According to the State of Michigan Compiled Laws - Mich. Comp. Laws § 432.103 Additional definitions

- (k) "Service organization" means either of the following:
- (i) A branch, lodge, or chapter of a national or state organization that is organized not for pecuniary profit and that is authorized by its written constitution, charter, articles of incorporation, or bylaws to engage in a fraternal, civic, or service purpose within the state.
- (ii) A local civic organization that is organized not for pecuniary profit; that is not affiliated with a state or national organization; that is recognized by resolution adopted by the local governmental subdivision in which the organization conducts its principal activities; whose constitution, charter, articles of incorporation, or bylaws contain a provision for the perpetuation of the organization as a nonprofit organization; whose entire assets are used for charitable purposes; and whose constitution, charter, articles of incorporation, or bylaws contain a provision that all assets, real property, and personal property shall revert to the benefit of the local governmental subdivision that granted the resolution upon dissolution of the organization.

Dear Ms. Halberstadt.

My name is Susan McAdams, and I am the Executive Director of a nonprofit, Global Health Charities, based here in Farmington, Michigan. Our mission to work to reduce neonatal and material mortality in remote global communities.

One of our major programs is the development of Clean Birth Kits, which provide women with essential items for a clean birth: a plastic birthing surface, razor blade, gauze, etc. We do this by engaging academic, faith-based, corporate and community organizations to gather, fund and assemble kits with us on a regular basis.

We are applying for a Gaming license from the State of Michigan for a fundraising event we are holding at the Inn at St. Johns in Plymouth, Michigan on October 6th, 2017. I was advised by the State of Michigan that I need to have the City of Farmington provide a "Local Governing Body Resolution for Charitable Gaming License", which I have attached.

My goal was to submit our application to the State on August 28th, 2017, to allow 6 weeks for processing time, but know obtaining the city resolution may take some time.

Thank you for your assistance with this. Both the founder and and I are Farmington Hills residents and proud members of the Farmington community! Our founder is also the President and Founder of Global Health Services Network, a for-profit located at 23917 Cass Street in Farmington. Her husband, Dr. Joe Williams, also has a medical practice in Farmington (Williams Family and Sports Medicine).


